About the project under HRLP

This project is about dovetailing Curriculum Development, Research and Training of Young Lawyers and Law Students to strengthen synergies between law, practice and policy, to facilitate access to justice.

Objectives

The Objectives of this program are-

1. Bridging silos between law schools, lawyers and legal aid institutions by identifying and addressing gaps
2. Scaling up or setting up of existing clinical courses and legal services clinics at law schools
